




# **GOSPEL CANTICLE**

# Lord, have mercy.


For deliverance in the time of affliction, wrath, danger, and need, let us | pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**


Help, save, comfort, and defend us, gracious Lord. *A time of silence follows.*


